


Digit card place value game

Digit card place value game

You will need:

- multiple sets of 0 9 digit cards
- some counters, buttons, pennies, etc.
- a pencil and paper (optional)

This is a game for 2 to 5 children.

Place the counters or small items in the middle of the table

The adult shuffles all the cards and then deals 10 to each child.

The children look at their own cards and will decide which cards to play in each round of the game.

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- Start by asking each child to place one card face down on the table. When instructed to do so, the children turn over the cards at the same time. The one with the largest number wins 1 counter.
- This time the players put two cards down to make a two-digit number. Again they turn over the cards together. The child with the largest number wins 2 counters.
- Repeat making the largest three-digit number, the largest wins 3 counters.
- Repeat making the largest four-digit number, the largest wins 4 counters.
- Collect all the cards in again and repeat the game. The first child to win 25 counters wins the game.

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
